### Sports News

This term we have completed in three Inter-school competitions.

In October, seven Year 1s represented the school in a KS1 football tournament at Caister Junior School. They were playing against mostly Year 2s and the size difference was noticeable! However, all seven children played incredibly well, celebrated their goal with enthusiasm and were a credit to the school in their first tournament.

Also in October a team from Years 5 & 6 went to Ormiston Venture Academy for a basketball tournament. Both teams equipped themselves well and won several games.

We took two teams to the Premier Sport Dodgeball Competition at Ormiston Venture Academy in November. Priory White team played well in their four games and were unlucky to win just one after some very close matches. Priory Orange team did fantastically well, winning five of their six games in the tournament, culminating in beating Ormiston in the final. It was the second year in a row that the KS2 Dodgeball team had won this tournament. Well done



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## Year 1

Year 1 have had an exciting half term and have been learning about Pokémon! We have learnt the classic children's story "We're Going On A Bear Hunt" by Michael Rosen and have adapted it for our own books called "We're going on a Pokémon Hunt!" The children have also designed their own Pokémon creatures.

As the weather is getting worse, the children need to make sure they have warm clothing each day. Lots of learning happens outside and so children require a coat in school. Children without a coat aren't able to go outside and are missing valuable learning opportunities because of this. A hat, gloves and scarf may also be necessary when it is particularly cold. A set of wellington boots is also a good idea for the children (especially when it has been raining or we are experimenting with water!) so children may wish to bring a set of named wellingtons in as well. These can be kept on their peg.

PE lessons also take place outside (unless it is wet) so children need a winter PE kit. The children will need a black sport jacket/jumper, a pair of black tracksuit bottoms and a pair of trainers (plimsolls get very wet on the playground when it has been raining).

It is vitally important that <u>all</u> children have their PE kit in school on PE day. PE is an essential part of the curriculum and is compulsory for all children. PE kit needs to be:

- Plain white T-shirt (a small logo for the make is acceptable but no slogans)

- Black shorts, leggings or tracksuit/jogging bottoms (patterned leggings are not acceptable).

- A black jumper or sweatshirt (a small logo for the make is acceptable but no slogans)

- trainers

Our PE days are: Year 1 - Friday Year 3 - Thursday Year 4 - Wednesday Year 5 - Tuesday Year 6 - Friday

On Christmas Eve this year there is a re-telling of We're Going On A Bear Hunt on Channel 4 at 7:30pm. The children will love watching this and joining in as they watch! Make sure you catch it.

Please remember to hear your child read over the Christmas holidays. We know you may be very busy but regular reading for 10 minutes with your child will make a huge difference. Thanks.
