# **Playground Gates**

Just to remind you, school starts at 8.40am; children in Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 will receive a 'late' mark if they arrive after 8.50am. Children in Reception and Year 1 will receive a 'late' mark if they arrive after 9am. It is very important that your children arrive on time to ensure they do not miss out on important learning.



#### **News from Reception**

Reception made flags and visited the Minster as part of the Commonwealth Day celebrations last week. They watched excitedly as Rev Jemma Sander-Heys raised the commonwealth flag high up above the Minster as they waved their own flags from below.

The children have been learning about road safety with Benjamin and Bethany Bear this week. They have also been learning about the Chinese New Year this term and the topic for next term will be 'Changes Over Time.'

The 'Gingerbread Man' and 'Three Billy Goats Gruff' are the stories children have been discussing as part of their 'Talk for Writing.' Next term's stories will be 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and 'Little Red Riding Hood.'



#### News from Year 1

We have had a very green Spring Term! During the first half of the term, the children learnt lots about trees to answer the question 'Why are trees special?' We looked at what trees provide for us, which animals benefit from trees and how we can help reduce the number of trees we cut down. Our work went toward the 'Woodland Trust Green Tree School' award and (so far) we have gualified for a bronze award! A super effort from Year 1!



This half term, we have been growing! Our big question has been 'What will I become.' The children enjoyed having chicks hatch in the classroom and watching them peck, scrap and flutter around! We have also planted lots of flowers in class and hope to plant these outside after Easter to brighten the Year 1 outside area.

Next term Year 1 will be looking at Space!



#### **News from Year 4**

Year 4 continue to study the Greeks and Romans this half term. On Wednesday this week, Year 4 classes performed their Greek and Roman Forum to decide 'Who is our favourite Ancient Hero and Why?' at St George's Theatre. The children were all very excited and enjoyed donning their costumes!

The contest was light hearted, X-factor style format with famous historical figures competing for the title of Favourite Ancient Hero. Our contestants included on the Roman side 'Pliny the Younger', 'Julius Caesar' and 'Emperor Augustus.' 'Cleisthenes,' the founder of democracy represented Ancient Greeks, and we had our own home grown hero, 'Boudicca' for the Celtic Iceni Tribe who was crowned the winner. The children did brilliantly and the battle enactment was enjoyed by all. The Roman honey cakes went down well!

The children will be visiting the Time and Tide Museum on 31st March and there will be an event at the Minster after school (more details to follow).

After Easter, the children will be learning about the history and geography of Great Yarmouth.

#### News from Year 5

Classes have visited Great Yarmouth High School where the children have had chance to sample science, PE and cookery. There are plans to visit Trafalgar College after Easter and arrangements are being made to visit more high schools later on in the term.

Lynn Grove High School will be coming in to do a science roadshow with the children in May.

Jamie, Callum and Marc recently represented the school in a chess tournament at St George's Primary School.

James in 5A has recently completed a grading for his Kuk Sool Won. He is currently a brown belt and is now working towards his black belt.

The children have designed their perfect playgrounds using CAD software and will be making these into 3D models before the end of term. They have also written a persuasive letter to the council, trying to persuade them to use their designs in future playground planning in Great Yarmouth.

Next term is set to be action packed with many exciting activities planned.







#### News from Year 6

Year 6 are working very hard and getting ready for their national curriculum tests in May.

In science, they will be learning about 'living things and their habitats,' and 'Evolution and inheritance.' In literacy, they will be working on a newspaper article on a dinosaur sighting, writing about fossils and composing a 'lost world' story. This will be followed by making large models of mythical creatures and fossils in art and DT.
