**Curriculum Information: Year 2** 

Summer Term 2017/2018

## Art skills:

Focusing on DT skills, the children will select from a range of tools and equipment to design and produce their own model boat. They will explore and evaluate a range of materials and communicate their ideas.

### Scientific & technological skills:

The children will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials and explore how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

#### **Humanities skills:**

Focusing on geographical skills, the children will use maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its four countries and their capitals. They will study the human and physical geography of Great Yarmouth and Kenya.

#### Maths skills:

In year 2 we follow the Collins Maths programme which focuses on the key skills of number and place value, calculations, fractions, measurements, geometry and statistics.

## English skills:

The children will continue to build upon previous grammatical skills to produce a non-fiction information text about Great Yarmouth. They will learn how to edit and re-draft their work, writing an evaluation of their boat design.

## Understanding physical development, health & well-being:

The children will participate in team games, learning how to develop simple tactics for attacking and defending.

#### Music skills:

The children will study the Charanga music programme focusing on songs and music from the unit of work 'Do you wanna be in a band?'

In year 2, children will focus on the social, moral, spiritual and religious understanding through the whole school initiative of PATHS. Their 'big' question for RE is:
