Consultation on latest Preventing Homelessness and Rough Sleeping Strategy from Great Yarmouth Borough Council

At Housing and Neighbourhoods Committee on 6th September 2018, members agreed to move forward with the Borough Council's latest Preventing Homelessness and Rough Sleeping Strategy.

Our latest Preventing Homelessness and Rough Sleeping Strategy identifies five strategic objectives;

- Early intervention and prevention of homelessness
- Increasing access to good quality, well managed accommodation in the private rented sector
- Ensuring a stock of temporary accommodation to meet the needs of homeless applicants
- Working with local partners to provide solutions which prevent homelessness
- Reduce the incidence of rough sleeping in the borough.

We see the production of this strategy as timely with the recent introduction of the Homelessness Reduction Act (HRA) which, is the most significant change to homelessness legislation since it was first introduced in the 1970's.

We would see this strategy as making a positive contribution by focusing the activities of all relevant local partners to reducing and preventing homelessness within the Borough.

Therefore, before we finalise the way forward to its implementation we welcome any comments from individuals and/or stakeholders as to how this should work in practise

Homeless Reduction Act 2018 Duty to refer briefing sessions

A new duty to refer for certain public authorities will commence in October, this year, and will apply to:

- prisons (public and contracted out)
- youth offender institutions and youth offending teams
- secure training centres (public and contracted out) and colleges
- probation services (community rehabilitation companies and national probation service)
- jobcentre plus
- accident and emergency services provided in a hospital
- urgent treatment centres, and hospitals in their capacity of providing inpatient treatment
- Norfolk County Council Social Services.
- Ministry of Defence for Royal Navy, Royal Marines, regular army and Royal Air Force.
- Hospitals in their function of providing inpatient care

If you work for one of these organisations, we would like to invite you to attend a briefing session.

We are offering 4 sessions and they will all be held in the Supper Room in the Town Hall, Great Yarmouth.

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
