Curriculum Information

Autumn Term 2018/2019

Art skills:

This term the children will be designing and creating a box based on World War 2 packaging. This box will be a replica ration box that people would of used during the war.

Technological skills:

The children will use Computing programs throughout their ICT lessons which will help them to design their packaging for their ration box.

Modern Foreign Languages:

We will be learning French! The children will begin to develop their vocabulary about the family and school.

Humanities skills:

The children will learn about the history of Great Britain in the time of World War Two. The children will have the opportunity to visit Coventry on their school trip and learn about how Coventry was affected during the war. We will also be using our geography skills to locate other countries that were impacted.

Maths skills:

The children in Year 6 will begin the autumn term focussing on their arithmetic skills. In particular a focus on adding, subtracting, dividing and multiplying.

English skills:

Writing this term will initially be based around the war, concentrating on an information text, a newspaper article and a diary entry of what it was like to be a child evacuee at that time.

Our REAL project for the Autumn Term is:

World War Two

Our essential question is: Should the past be forgotten?

Music skills:

The children will be creating pieces of music using voice and a range of instruments. They will also develop their understanding or written music.

Understanding physical development, health & well-being:

The year will begin with invasion games and developing ball skills. The children will also develop their team work skills and how to communicate during a game.

Social, Moral, Spiritual & Religious Education

PHSE: The children will follow the PATHS programme to understand their emotions and emotions and behaviours of others.

RE: The children will learn more about why there is suffering in the world and what this means to Buddhists as well as understanding whether it is ever right to use violence and whether or not Hindus believe this.
