Please do feel free to come along and enjoy a nice cup of tea with delicious cake.



MULTI-DISCIPLINARY WORKER – DIAL

This is a 2 year extension to the Big Lottery Funded Project working collaboratively with Partners and local communities to transform the way services are delivered as part of Great Yarmouth's Neighbourhoods That Work (NTW) Programme.



The key elements of the role will be to provide relevant and timely advice to people who face complicated life challenges, working collaboratively with communities to embed first step support at neighbourhood level. The post holder will work as part of a NTW team that supports the join-up of local services and which recognises and responds to the strengths of local people and their communities.

The post holder will work closely with the NTW programme and other local agencies. This will ensure that the provision of specialist and community-based support is integrated, reducing confusion amongst vulnerable people who are trying to access the programme, and making it easier for other partners, projects and outreach teams to work with the NTW programme.
