

SUPPORT SERVICES




The RAF Benevolent Fund has set up a new service in the East of England across four counties- Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridge and Lincolnshire, in the form of Community Engagement Workers. Our role is two-fold, firstly to promote the work of the RAF Benevolent Fund in order to allow those that need help to get the help that they are entitled to. (This can be either financial help across a whole spectrum of need-from assistance with a new fridge, help to pay for a gardener, weekly financial assistance right through to helping with making a home more suitable for a person to live independently. We also offer a range of none means tested help such as Bereavement Counselling, Telephone Friendship Groups and other emotional wellbeing services.) The second part of my role is to work with lonely and isolated individuals within their local community to try and re-engage them and to try and help identify the barriers around this.
