You are invited to a Mystery Lunch at Great Yarmouth Library, on 29th November 12.30 – 1.30pm celebrating Yarmouth Mysteries, an Arts Council England supported project led by writer Ruthie Collins. This is a relaxed lunch, with the chance to enjoy literary Yarmouth – micro stories written by women inspired by women of Great Yarmouth, as well as stories written by children at St George’s Primary School, characters created by families in Great Yarmouth Library, plus an insight into inspiration in Great Yarmouth, as a writer. It’s family friendly, so those with young children can attend with a Yarmouth Treasure Hunt for kids and fun activities.

A number of vibrant circus-inspired costumes, posters and props will be on display that inspired the stories, from Time and Tide Museum. Educators, or those with budding young writers at home – take a free colour copy of an A3 poster sharing tips on creative writing for children, shared by children at St George’s Primary School. Find out top spots to write in Great Yarmouth, plus uncover what residents feel is its hidden treasure in the community.

Yarmouth Mysteries is partnered with the National Centre for Writing, Great Yarmouth Borough Council, Great Yarmouth Library and original projects. Hopkins Charitable Fund

Six Norfolk charities have been shortlisted for the Hopkins Homes Norfolk Charity vote. Voting opens today and the charities could receive a share of £10,000.

The shortlist has been compiled by Hopkins Homes with support from the Norfolk Community Foundation and focuses on key themes of homelessness and displacement, deprivation and vulnerable people:

1. About with Friends – supports individuals living with disabilities helping them live life to the full through programmes which include workskills, respite and home support services.
2. Daisy programme – provides long term support, including specialist counselling, programmes and social activities to men or women in the Breckland area affected by domestic abuse.
3. DIAL – offers free confidential financial and personal advice to disabled and vulnerable people in the borough of Great Yarmouth.
4. St Martins Trust aims to maximise independent living and prevent homelessness by offering a hand up – housing, support and care – to the most vulnerable.
5. Sunbeams Play is an Ofsted registered charity based in Great Yarmouth supporting children, young people and families affected by autism through 1-1 sessions, groups, advocacy and training.
6. The Matthew Project supports young people, veterans, professionals, people in recovery, their family and carers who are affected by substance misuse.

The three charities with the most votes when it closes at 5pm Friday 6th December will receive a share of £10,000 (first place £7,000; second £2,000 and third £1,000).
